Today should have been the last day of our Spring Term. We were looking forward to a celebration assembly, sharing great work from the term and the anticipation of a nice two week break. Unfortunately our term ended prematurely and this has not been possible.

We currently find ourselves in uncharted territory, managing a situation that we could have never have imagined possible a few weeks ago. This has brought home lots of different emotions in people and many of you are understandably stressed and worried about how you are going to look after your children over the forthcoming weeks and possibly months.

I would like to make it clear that this is an emergency situation and you should not be feeling worried or pressured about 'home-schooling' your child.

You can only do what you can do – there are no rights or wrongs.

Staff at school, are aiming to offer you as much support as possible by providing learning opportunities through the VLE on the school website.

If this helps, then great. If it doesn't, please don't worry; please remember the following:

- You are the first and best educator of your child during these times. If your child will not engage with the learning, then please do not worry. WE know that some children will love engaging in these activities and we know that some children would prefer playing in the garden, baking, watching YouTube or bouncing around the living room. Just let them – do not stress or worry about it.
- Your child will not fall behind if they do less work than others say they are doing. All the work that we are setting is to review, revise and embed learning that has already taken place in school – the teachers at Mablins are amazing and will soon get everyone back on track when we return to school.
- ALL learning is valuable playing with Lego, baking, singing, dancing, drawing or painting a picture and kicking a football are all just as important as written tasks.
- If you have a question or query then just ask. We will do everything we can to support you.

School OPEN!!

The school has continued to open over the week for the children of our key workers. It is important to point out that we are offering a child care facility for Key Workers where there is no other availability for care.

The staff have been in on a rota and it has been good to work together. We have all joined in the 09:00 PE session with Joe Wickes and then taken on the daily mile! (I am getting fitter by the day!)

Provision will continue over the Easter period, including the Bank Holidays.



Each of these small actions is a prayer in itself and shows 'We keep calm and carry on'.







Reading

Math's Challenge

Mrs Joule's maths challenge!

Every week I will be putting together a challenge for the

family to work together on to solve.

My first challenge relates to maths below: This challenge is all based around factors.

A factor is a number that will divide into a larger number without leaving any remainder.

Example: The factors of 12 are 1, 2, 3, 4, 6 and 12. The number 6 is a very special number because if you add its factors together (apart from 6) it equals 6:

The factors of 6 are 1, 2, 3, and 6

and

1+2+3=6.

6 is an example of a PERFECT NUMBER

Challenge 1:

There is 1 other number that is less than 100 that is a perfect number.

Can you find it?

Challenge 2:

If you want a really hard challenge there is one other number that is bigger than 100 but smaller than 500 that is a perfect number.

See if you can find that one.
