Dear Parents and Children,

We are at the end of our first full week back in school. The children have settled so quickly, especially our new EYFS children. We are very proud of you all. There have been lots of exciting things happening in school already, and we know that there is so much to look forward to.

Thought of the Week



COVID

In line with Local Authority advice we have opened the school cautiously. Whilst restrictions across the country are easing and it feels like things are getting back to how they were, we must be mindful that Covid has not gone away. We currently have four children out of school because they have received a positive PCR result and one teacher. (Previously we have only ever had one or two cases at a time.)

If your child does show any symptoms at all then please do not send them in to school.

If anybody in your house receives a positive result then please isolate and do not come to school.

A positive LFT result should be followed by a PCR test and pupils should not come to school until a negative PCR result is received.

When we are made aware of a positive case we will distribute a 'Warn and Inform' letter to the relevant families. We do not have to close 'bubbles' and only the 'positive' family needs to isolate, but contacts need to be vigilant for signs and seek a PCR test if any symptoms arise. At all times we advise caution and consideration. Children often have very mild, or no symptoms at all and this is what fuels transmission. Please contact the school office or Public Health if you are unsure of steps to take.



FACE MASKS – we are still encouraging families to wear a face covering whilst on site. Anybody entering the school building to visit the school office **MUST** wear a face covering. We are still looking to keep visitors on site to a minimum to reduce the risk of transmission.

SOCIAL DISTANCING – we are still encouraging families to observe the 2m social distancing measures, particularly whilst waiting on the playground. It is requested that only 1 adult per family comes on site to collect children and that they stick to the drop off and collection times. At the end of the day we ask that families move quickly from the site and disperse accordingly.

ONE WAY SYSTEM – THIS REMAINS IN OPERATION ACROSS THE SCHOOL SITE Many parents have challenged this over the last week (some rather rudely!) but we have retained the one way system in order that there is no crossing. Evidence has shown that where people are travelling in the same direction there is a slightly reduced risk of transmission.

ONE WAY SYSTEM IN OPERATION

TESTING - Staff will continue to take regular LFT tests and respond to results accordingly. The vast majority of staff are double vaccinated and continue to take precautions in order to reduce transmission.

STAGGERED START/FINISH TIMES - We amended the start and end times of the school day in order to reduce congestion around the school site which led to us to survey parents and make this a permanent change. We have been monitoring the 'flow' of people and congestion in order to keep our site as safe as possible. We believe that the staggered timings have helped congestion considerably, and the site feels safer for the children **BUT** we would like to make one amendment to see if this can be further improved.

FROM MONDAY 13TH SEPTEMBER YEAR 4 WILL END THE DAY AT 3pm - This adjustment will allow Y4 parents to clear the playground prior to Y1 and Y2 parents. The 15 minutes from the end of the day will be adjusted in the timetable around break and lunch times.

Tablets

It has been fantastic to see the children using their tablets again in school already this term. Many families have returned the



parental agreement and those children are taking their tablets home to support homework activities.

Some parents have chosen not to sign and accept the tablet at home. Please be assured that this is entirely your obligation. Where a signed parental agreement is not in place those children will just use the tablet in school. School will take full responsibility for that tablet. Each family should individually make a decision based on their circumstances.

PLEASE NOTE: the tablets have a security system which only allows the tablet to be used for specified apps. Children will not be able to download or play games on them and it is not set up for internet shopping! Also – should the tablet be mis-placed, they all have a tracker and the tablet will be immediately dis-abled. Children are also not to put a login password on the tablets either, as we just want them to turn them on and be ready to go!

Timings

Please remember that we have new start times;

Year 5 & 6 - 08:40 Year 3 & 4 - 08:50 Year 1 & 2 - 08:55 EYFS - 09:00

These are the times the REGISTER will be taken in each year group. If your child misses registration they are classed as late and will be marked 'L' in the register. Several 'L' marks will trigger a call from the Education Welfare Officer and could incur a fine.

The doors will open 10 minutes before the start time. SLT will be on the gates and in the playground to direct and support families.

PLEASE STICK TO THE ALLOACTED TIMES FOR YOUR YEAR GROUP IN ORDER TO KEEP CONGESTION TO A MINIMUM.

Uniform

It has been lovely to see the children back in smart uniform. Please make sure that all clothing is named. Name labels are available from the school office if required at a competitive price.

A reminder that children should be wearing school shoes now and not trainers. If children wish to play on the 'astro' pitches during break times they must change into a pair of trainers.

PE kits should be brought in to school for PE days and the children will change in school. PE kit should be plain – not football kits or beach wear please. Plain dark shorts/ joggers and a white/blue t shirt. A reminder that jewellery including earrings MUST NOT be worn in PE sessions. This is following Cheshire East Health and Safety guidance.

PCSO

Over the coming weeks Matt Oliver our PCSO will be patrolling in the vicinity of the school during pick up and drop off times. (I am already aware that a ticket has been issued for inappropriate parking in the Bus Stop.) He will be monitoring conduct around the school and checking on safe and appropriate parking. On some occasions speed checks may also be undertaken. Please drive and park safely.

Our PC and PCSO have asked us to share this message with you:

Parents/ Guardians of Mablins Lane Primary School, As the local beat officers for Leighton we would like to welcome you to another school year.

We are writing to inform those when collecting or dropping off children and parking their vehicle in the surrounding area the importance of legal parking. As beat officers, we aim to upkeep the safety of the students on their way to/from school. To ensure this, we look to keep the congestion of traffic to a minimum on busy roads such as Mablins Lane and Parkers Road. When parking your vehicle, please be aware not to commit any of the following offences that may result in a £30 Fixed Penalty Notice whilst putting the students in danger.

- Parking across from a junction
- Obstructing a dropped curb
- Parking in a bus lane
- Parking on zigzag lines
- Parking and obstructing a pavement

We look to work with parents/guardians to achieve this goal, if you see us on patrol feel free to come chat to us. Additionally, to lighten the build of vehicles around the school, the Eight Farmers pub have granted parents/guardians the use of their carpark at drop off/collection times.

The school site follows a NO smoking policy. This includes vaping. Please can we remind all families to stick to this rule when collecting children and waiting on the playground or car park. Thank you.




Medical Reviews & Forms
