WW1 Commemoration Week

During our first week back after the half term holiday all pupils across the school participated in activities allowing them to learn about and reflect upon the centenary of the ending of World War 1.

During the week pupils engaged in a variety of activities including Y6 working with the poet John Lindley. Some beautiful atmospheric poetry was produced. Well done Year 6.

Other year groups were fortunate enough to engage in drama workshops (Meet Vera) allowing pupils to empathise with events from the era and engage through acting and mime.

English planning for the week focussed on literature linked to the time period. As pupils learnt about events in 1918 they expressed themselves in a variety of ways including some superb art work. Joy prepared a commemorative lunch enjoyed by many, and all pupils had a special home baked biscuit during the afternoon. It was a good opportunity for the children to consider how very different our meals are now with a far greater variety of foods available to us. Thanks again to Joy and the kitchen staff for supporting our learning.



Minshull Vernon and District Parish Council also presented a special commemorative coin to every child in school to remember the fallen 1914-1918. Thank you to the Parish Council for this kind gift.





The week ended with a special assembly on Friday led by Reverend Goggin. Pupils came to school dressed to represent the era or in their association uniforms (Scouting/Brownies). Our Early Years pupils dressed in red and green to resemble the colours of the poppies. Reverend Goggin talked about the poppy symbol and the river of poppies in London. A minutes silence was held at 11am with the whole school falling silent. I am very proud of the way our school family stopped to remember.

In addition to the above, some of our Y6 pupils joined with other Crewe Schools for a 'commemorative walk' around Crewe on Saturday afternoon. At various points the walk stopped for specific memories and events to be shared.

On Armistice Day, Sunday 11th November, Mrs Wagstaffe and the School Council were our representatives taking part in the Crewe Town Parade. A wreath was laid on behalf of the school.

Open Morning

Our Autumn Term Open Morning was held on Thursday allowing parents to come in and share some of our commemorative events with our families. It was lovely to see those of you who were able to attend and we had some very positive comments as people left at the end of the morning.

We also welcomed 17 new families who had the opportunity to look around the school guided by representatives of the School Council. Forest Schools

By the end of the school year we hope that every child will have had access to some Forest school sessions. Currently Year 6 are having sessions on Wednesday mornings and have already been involved in some tricky problem solving activities. Year 5 have accessed some whole class sessions over the last few Fridays where they have had to work in teams and develop good skills of cooperation. Basketball Competition

This year we entered the basketball competition for the first time and were able to enter 3 teams. Our A team won their match and will now progress to the finals. Well done everyone that took part!
