A baby has been born, it is not a boy though! We are very pleased to inform parents that Mrs Stant has a new baby daughter. We are looking forward to




welcoming them in to school in the near future.

Weston Christmas Lights Display

'Weston Christmas Light Display' – This is a festive charity community fundraising event, on the outskirts of Crewe which raises money for the 'Donna Louise' Children's Hospice in Trentham.



So far, through generous visitor donations they have raised a remarkable £92,310 over the last six years, with £26,760 raised just last December. This amazing amount of money has been raised through visitor donations (over 15,000 visitors last December!) and has funded a variety of different projects at the hospice (i.e. sign and symbol communication workshops for nurses). The aim this year is to top the £100,000 fundraising milestone which would be a phenomenal community achievement.

The Weston Christmas Light Display will shine bright every evening until 28th December, from 6.15pm – 9pm, at Carters Green Farm, Jack Lane, Weston, CW2 5LE. Santa will be there every Friday, Saturday, Sunday evening and each night the last week before Christmas, so families and children can enjoy their own #SleighSelfie with the big man himself! Everyone's welcome! Do consider a visit to support this local charity.

Uniform

It has been great to see the children in their lovely uniform this half term. They generally look very smart with school shoes and sweatshirts. As the
