**COVID** 

We currently have twelve children out of school because they have received a positive PCR. (At the time of writing.) We also have four further children waiting for PCR results. We still have one member of staff who has tested positive. Numbers are very high across Cheshire East and we ask that families are vigilant.

Public Health have provided us with some more information and additional measures to take.

- If your child does show any symptoms at all then please do not send them in to school. This includes heavy colds and headaches.
- If anybody in your house receives a positive result then please follow current guidance on isolation.
   Do not come to school if you are positive.
- The advice is for families to take twice weekly LFT tests where possible to enable positive cases to be identified earlier.

**SOCIAL DISTANCING** – we are still encouraging families to observe the 2m social distancing measures, particularly whilst waiting on the playground. It is requested that only **1 adult per family** comes on site to collect children and that they stick to the drop off and collection times. At the end of the day we ask that families move quickly from the site and disperse accordingly.



**ONE WAY SYSTEM** – this remains in operation across the school site.

This number is **ONLY** for reporting a positive test. Please leave a message and we will then operate our positive reporting plan.

Where there has been a positive case in a class we will send out a 'Warn and Inform letter' to that class. We will deep clean the classroom if the child has been in school. Please also be vigilant at home and monitor symptoms. If in doubt take an LFT or PCR test immediately.

We will continue to keep year groups separate and use outdoor spaces where possible. Ventilation is key, as is hand washing and cleaning. All are a high priority.

We currently have 8 classes affected with positive cases, and are pleased that we do not have to send them home and revert to on-line learning, but where there are multiple cases in a class this will be a next step. Please help us to contain the virus so that we do not have to take this measure.

#### **Returning to school**

Please have a safe half term break making good consideration for local restrictions. After half term we urge families only to return to school if they are well and not displaying any Covid symptoms. If in any doubt, please seek a PCR test which will confirm your status to return.


