Year 1 African Dancers

Pre-School at Mablins Lane

During our Open Morning we were very pleased to launch the opening of a new Pre-school at Mablins Lane. Rainbows Nursery who operate our 'All Stars Before and After School Club' are planning to open a pre-school provision in 2019. The number of places will be limited and we expect them to fill up very quickly. If you are interested in using this new facility then please contact the school office. We will then pass on the details to rainbows. We intend to work in very close collaboration with Rainbows and there will be lots of good transition and shared opportunities for pupils accessing the provision. Parents should be advised that funding can be split between providers and therefore any number of sessions can be booked.



Along with the Governors we are very excited about the launch of this new venture at Mablins Lane. As the details continue to be finalised we will keep parents informed. Watch this space!

Road Safety

Last week we had to take the decision to close the school gates to restrict vehicle access on site after school. We thank those parents who have not entered the car park and who have walked on the pavements. Unfortunately too many parents are driving irresponsibly in the car park and children are walking between cars. We feel that the situation is not safe and therefore have had to take the decision to close the gates. We are pleased to offer such a variety of clubs and activities after school, but this does mean that we have to release an increasing number of children at 4:15. We are using the two entrances at the front of school to ease the congestion but insist that all parents and pupils use the footpaths on the school site.

May I also take this opportunity to ask parents who drop off/collect in cars to remember to park legally and considerately on local roads. We continue to receive complaints from local residents about blocked driveways and reports of verbal abuse when challenged. Parking is available behind The Eight Farmers/Co-op and a Crossing Patrol is in place to help cross the main road safely.

Please note that our school gates do not open until 8.45am each morning. We have a number of children arriving at school as early as 8.20am and then waiting unsupervised for gates to open.
