






COVID Update

Unfortunately the situation is not improving and the arrival of the Omnicron variant seems to have increased the transmission rates.

We currently have **16 children** out of school because they have received a positive test. (At the time of writing.) Four members of staff are also currently absent due to Covid reasons.

New advice from DfE on self-isolation period for confirmed cases of Covid-19

The DfE Information email (4th Jan) has updated the guidance about when individuals can return to school.

This now says:

"Individuals may now take LFD tests on day 6 and day 7 of their self-isolation period. Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of self-isolation. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 6 of the self-isolation period and tests must be taken 24 hours apart. This also applies to children under 5, with LFT (Lateral flow test) testing at parental or guardian discretion. If both these test results are negative, and you do not have a high temperature, you may end your self-isolation after the second negative test result and return to your education or childcare setting from day 7."

Pupils

Cheshire East Public Health have therefore amended the advice to schools re. positive cases in pupils to align with this, recommending that schools gain assurance from the child or parent/carer that:

- They are well and symptom free
- They have had 2 negative LFT, at least 24hours apart
- They can return on day 7 after a negative LFT in the morning on that day if they also had a negative LFT in the morning of day 6.
- They do not return before 7th day after their symptoms started or they took a positive test, e.g., if symptoms started on Mon 1st then the earliest date of return would be Mon 8th.

This also applies to children under 5, with LFT testing at parental or guardian discretion.

Stay at home advice for household contacts

Although national guidance is that household contacts of positive cases can continue to attend education settings, the advice from Cheshire East Public Health remains the same as last term. This is that any child who is a household contact of a positive case stays away from the setting for 5 days and has a PCR test. Staff may continue to attend work but should also take a PCR test and daily LFT. Their work should be risk assessed to minimise contact, especially with any clinically vulnerable individuals.

This advice is under review and any changes will be shared as soon as agreed.

FACE MASKS – The rules around face coverings has changed so that they are compulsory in shops and on public transport.

We are still looking to keep visitors on site to a minimum to reduce the risk of transmission.

SOCIAL DISTANCING – we are still encouraging families to observe the 2m social distancing measures, particularly whilst waiting on the playground. It is requested that only **1 adult per family** comes on site to collect children and that they stick to the drop off and collection times. At the end of the day we ask that families move quickly from the site and disperse accordingly.



ONE WAY SYSTEM – this remains in operation across the school site.


