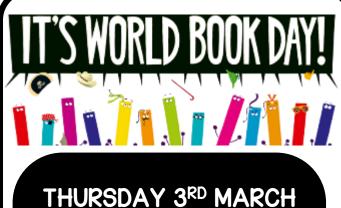

The theme for this day is 'Break the Bias' and 'Women of Words' where they will have interactive celebrations complete with guest speakers and marketplaces supporting small businesses.

COVID Update

We currently have **6 children** out of school because they have received a positive test. (At the time of writing.) **Two** members of staff are also currently absent due to positive Covid results.

PLEASE HELP EVERYBODY TO SAFE AND CONTINUE TO FOLLOW THIS GUIDANCE.

FACE MASKS — All staff will continue to wear a face covering in communal areas of the school. Visitors are being kept to an absolute minimum and year groups are working independently.

SOCIAL DISTANCING – we are still encouraging families to observe the 2m social distancing measures, particularly whilst waiting on the playground. It is requested that only **1 adult per family** comes on site to collect children and that they stick to the drop off and collection times. At the

end of the day we ask that families move quickly from the site and disperse accordingly.

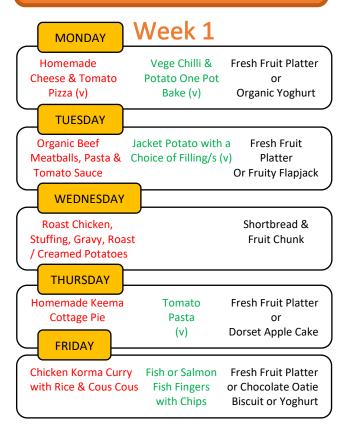

Swimming Pool



A POOL IS COMING!

During the pandemic we have been unable to deliver swimming lessons as we have done before. It is also now extremely costly to transport the children to the Lifestyle Centre in the town. We have found a solution whereby a training pool can be set up on the playground. We have visited other primary schools to see the effectiveness and now feel that this is something we can trial at Mablins. The pool is due to arrive mid-April and it will be in use for 3 weeks. It will allow all our Y4 pupils to have an intensive course of swimming lessons in groups of 9/10 pupils. We are also hoping that the timetable will facilitate some opportunity for Y5 to have some sessions. Year 6 non-swimmers will still have the opportunity to access the 'Top-Up' swimming sessions held by the sports partnership later in the summer term.

We are very excited by this opportunity. Further details will follow to Year 4/5.

<u>Queen's Diamond Jubilee</u> <u>celebrations</u>

The Queen's Diamond Jubilee bank holiday is scheduled during the May half term. (We had our additional Bank Holiday at the end of the



Christmas break.) We are currently planning a week of celebration and activities for the week before the May half term. We plan to have a parade, picnic and dressing-up day along with lots of other activities. If parents have any suggestions, or can help in any way then please let us know.

Cyberbullying

During half term your children maybe spending more time on their smartphones, computers, tablets and gaming consoles. This can be great fun and a positive experience for children but we just wanted to give some advice if things go wrong.

How to Deal with Cyberbullying

- I. SAVE any evidence of bullying and show an adult.
- 2. BLOCK messages or the person. Do not respond to them in any way.
- 3. LOG OFF the site where the cyberbullying is happening.
- 4. TALK to someone you trust about it.

We would also like to remind parents about TIK TOK. The minimum age is 13 – we have children in school using TIK TOK and then encouraging friends to use it as well.

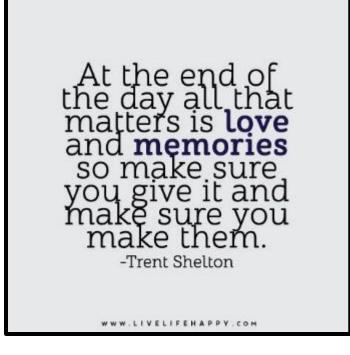


Half Term & Return to School Dates
