

Mobile Phones

Since Christmas we have noticed that more pupils are bringing phones with them to school. In line with our Mobile Phone Policy all phones must be handed to the class teacher at the start of the day. (Please see extract from the policy)



4. Use of mobile phones by pupils

Pupils are allowed to bring a mobile to school for the following circumstances:

Travelling to school by themselves

Young carers who need to be contactable

If Pupils bring phones to school, they must be handed over to the class teacher at the start of the day. They will be stored in an appropriate place until the end of the day. The responsibility of the phone lies with the family and not the school.

Pupils will NOT be allowed to use their phones during the school day.

4.1 Sanctions

If a pupil is in breach of this policy.

The phone will be confiscated? (Schools are permitted to confiscate phones from pupils under sections 91 and 94 of the Education and Inspections Act 2006)

If phones are confiscated, they will be placed in the secure storage location for that class until the end of the school day when they will be returned. Parents will be contacted.

SATs - Year 2 and Year 6

During the Spring Term there will be a concentrated focus on preparation for SATs. In Year 6 the children will undertake specific 'tests', while in Year 2 all assessments are undertaken through class based activities in a less formal way.

An information evening will be held for **Y6** parents on **Thursday 12**th **January at 3:30pm** in the main school hall. Children are invited to attend with their parents and siblings may also wait in the hall. This is an important session to help parents to understand the process and to give advice on how to support the children. Please attend if you can.

Strep A and Scarlet Fever

We received some very sad news as we returned to school that a Y1 pupil from a local Crewe school lost their life to Strep A over the Christmas period. We send our condolences to the family and have offered our support to the school.

We are still following guidance from the Local Authority and ask parents to remain extra vigilant. If your child becomes suddenly unwell then please seek immediate medical advice. If you get a confirmed case please inform the office as soon as possible. Thank you.

Signs and Symptoms of Scarlet Fever

Scarlet fever is a common childhood infection caused by Streptococcus pyogenes or Group A Streptococcus (GAS). It is not usually serious but should be treated with antibiotics. The early symptoms of scarlet fever include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours, the characteristic red, pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, then rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, and giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture. On white skin the rash looks pink or red. On brown and black skin, it might be harder to see a change in

colour, but you can still feel the sandpaper-like texture of the rash and see the raised bumps.

Action: Children and adults with suspected or confirmed scarlet fever should be excluded from nursery / school / work for at least 24 hours after the commencement of appropriate antibiotic treatment.

Contacts of Scarlet Fever cases (including siblings or household members) who are well and do not have symptoms do not require antibiotics and can continue to attend the setting. They should seek treatment if they develop symptoms.

There is no increased risk of complications for pregnant women but if you are concerned, please discuss with your midwife.

Winter respiratory illness

Many pupils and members of staff were absent before Christmas with a very nasty winter chest infection. The infection has made people very poorly and has lasted for weeks rather than days. If your child is unwell, then please do not send them to school, particularly if they are coughing. We are continuing to wash hands regularly and use hand sanitizer, as well as re-freshing the air at break times and following the 'catch it/bin it' approach.

COVID

We must also still be mindful that Covid has not gone away. Please help us all to stay well by following the guidance.

- If your child does show any symptoms at all then please do not send them in to school.
- If anybody in your house receives a positive result then that person should isolate and should not come to school.
- Please be vigilant where there are positive cases in the household.

The guidance is 5 days isolation for adults and 3 days for children. Thank you for your support.

Attendance

The number of severe winter illnesses has led to concerns about attendance. Our Education Welfare Officer visited this week and has supported in an Attendance analysis. Some parents may have received a letter just outlining absence and notifying them of the current position. Others may have received a warning letter saving that the absence is more concerning and may lead to further action. Several families will have received a telephone call to discuss the absence.

We understand that children can and will be ill. Our aim is to work with our families so that there is a clear

understanding and that all children are accessing the education that they are entitled to.

Please be reminded that requests for absence during term time should be made on the appropriate form. Absence for holidays cannot be authorised and a fixed penalty notice will be issued if the absence exceeds 10 session (5 days).
