

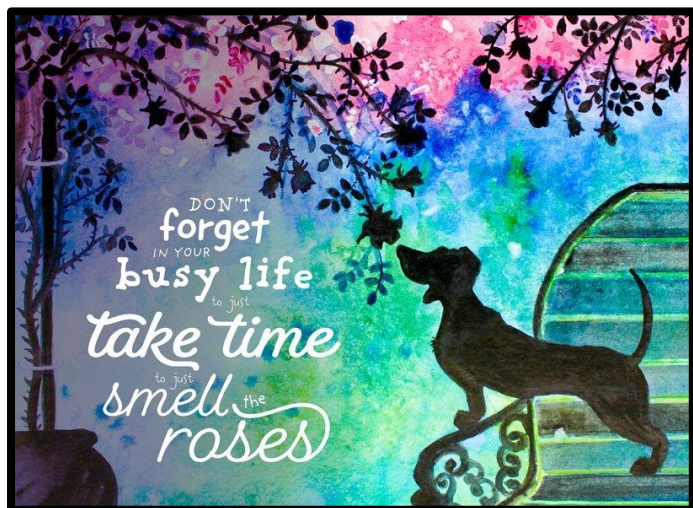
Mablins Lane Community Primary School Newsletter ~ 30th June 2023

Our team of athletes were able to compete in the rearranged field events meeting on Monday night. This was followed by the announcement of the final results.



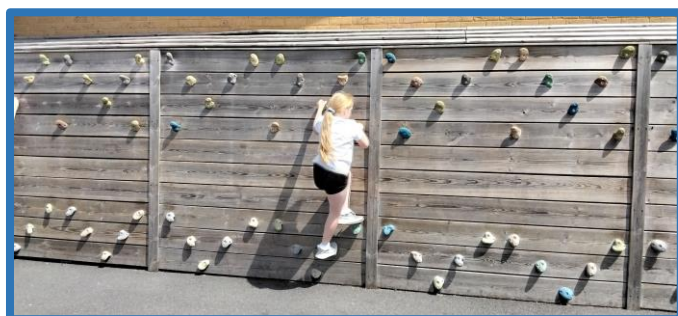

We have done our best to keep year groups open where possible, but some year groups will be closed on those days.

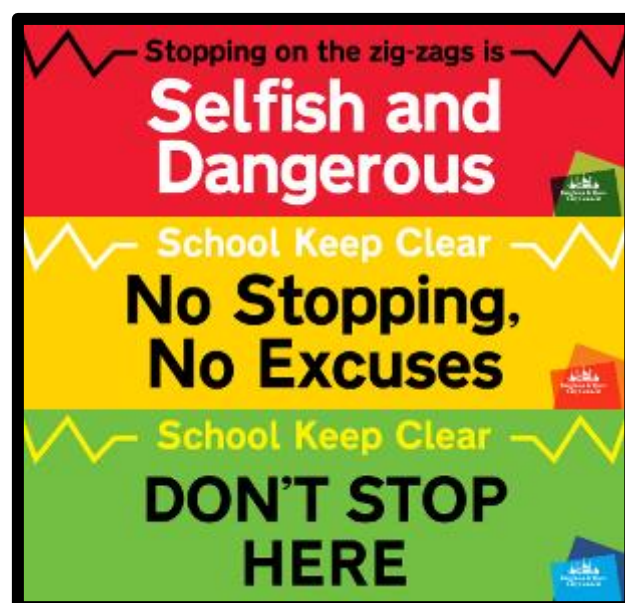
School Uniform

Health Alert

UKHSA has reported an increase in measles across the country and is encouraging people to check that they and their children have had two doses of the MMR vaccine. If children and young adults have missed these vaccinations in the past, they can get the vaccine now from GPs, particularly in light of the recent cases.

Anyone with symptoms is advised to stay at home and phone their GP/NHS 111 for advice.

Measles symptoms include:

- high fever
- sore, red, watery eyes
- coughing

- aching and feeling generally unwell
- a blotchy red brown rash, which usually appears after the initial symptoms.

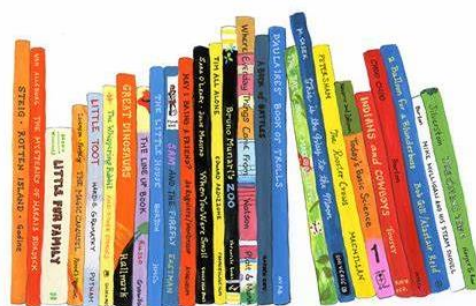

Cheshire East Council libraries

Cheshire East Council has launched a public consultation on a proposal to reduce the current opening hours of libraries across the borough so that all sites are closed for at least 1.5 days during the week and is now asking for feedback on how this could be implemented. The proposal follows the approval of the council's Medium Term Financial Strategy (MTFS) in February, which includes proposals for how the council will balance its budget for the next four years.

Cheshire East Holiday Activity and Food Programme (HAF)

Cheshire East Council has teamed up with a number of local schools, childcare and holiday club providers, community and voluntary organisations, to provide free fun activities during the summer holidays. The activities are available across Cheshire East for children and young people who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals (FSM). The free places are funded by the Department for Education as part of the government's [Holiday Activity and Food \(HAF\) programme](#) being delivered by local authorities across the country. This programme has already successfully run in Cheshire East during the 2021 and 2022 school holidays. Children and young people will be able to access a variety of free activity sessions during the summer school holidays, including specific provisions available for children with SEND or additional needs. The sessions will include a variety of fun activities, including sports, arts and crafts, baking/cooking, games, trips out and other exciting opportunities to learn and develop skills, alongside a nutritious meal each day.

Finding an activity to book onto is easy –

On this page there is an interactive Google map identifying the locations of our HAF providers across Cheshire East, so you will be able to find providers who are local to where you live or want to visit.

2. Once you have found a provider you are interested in, to find out more about them and to book onto their sessions you can visit the [Cheshire East Family Information Service Events](#) page. Once you are on this page you can search the provider by name, read their offer and book your place by following their booking instructions.

3. Alternatively, you can visit the [Cheshire East Family Information Service Events](#) page and browse the fantastic range of summer activities on offer. Our HAF logo will help you identify the activities that are part of this exciting summer HAF programme. When you find an activity, you can follow the HAF providers instructions and book your place.

Please be aware that places are limited, and spaces will go quickly.

The HAF programme offers a wide range of support for families and goes well beyond the delivery of food: it provides enriching activities and is an opportunity to learn and socialise, an important source of childcare, and a point of contact for children and families during holiday periods that can be vital for them in accessing support and services.
