
Dear Parents and Children,

Communication

A welcome back letter was distributed on Monday. This had information about communication. Start and End Timings

It has been lovely to see all the children arriving on time and getting used to their new year groups. Members of staff have been on the playground to assist and we hope that has been useful.

Welcome Meetings

We are pleased to invite all parents in Y1-Y6 to a Welcome Meeting next week as follows:

Monday 11th September - Y1 3:30pm and Y2 4:15pm

Tuesday 12th September – Y3 3:30pm and Y4 4:15pm

Wednesday 13th September – Y5 3:30pm and Y6 4:15pm

The 'Welcome Meetings' give an opportunity to meet the new staff and receive information about how each year group works. Parents are invited to visit their child's classroom, see where the children will be working, and get a general feel for where the children will be learning. For meetings held at 3:30pm this will be after the meeting in the main school hall. For 4:15pm meetings parents may visit the classrooms straight after school before the meeting in the main school hall.

Each year group will distribute an overview sheet outlining key information for their year group.

Each year group will also prepare their 'Curriculum Slice' which can be found on the school website from Monday 11th September. This outlines the areas of study for the Autumn Term for each year group.

School Uniform

The children look smart and it is great to see pride in our school uniform. The Uniform Policy can be found on the school website. Please note that white/coloured trainers are not part of the uniform policy. Jewellery should be kept minimal – a simple watch and small stud earrings.

PE kit should be provided for all PE sessions. Plain dark shorts and plain T shirt for indoors and joggers and sweatshirt for the colder months outdoors. Parents will be informed when each year group will be having PE sessions at the Welcome Meetings.

Home School Agreement

We will again be asking parents and pupils to sign the Home School Agreement. This will form part of the Welcome Meeting next week. Those parents unable to attend will be sent a copy to sign at home and return to school.

New Starters

We have been pleased to welcome 89 pupils to EYFS this week. On Monday and Tuesday the children attended for half days but from Wednesday they have been in school full time. They have been so grown up and we are very proud of them.

Cheshire School Admissions 2024!

Applications are now open for children starting primary school and transitioning to secondary school. Parents are strongly advised to apply for three preferences.

Applications must be submitted to the child's home local authority by:

- 31 October 2023 for pupils moving up to High School in September 2024
- 15 January 2024 for pupils starting primary in September 2024

Parents still need to apply even if the child has a brother or sister already at the school or the child is attending a nursery/preschool attached to the school.

Some faith schools may also require parents and carers to submit a supplementary information form/confirmation of baptism. Further information about this will be available on the school's website.

Parents should consider how their child will travel to school when making preferences. Parents can find out about school transport at Free and subsidised school transport (cheshireeast.gov.uk)

Packed lunches:

Some families prefer to provide a packed lunch for their child/children and we aim for packed lunches to be as healthy as they can be. If children have a packed lunch our packed lunch guidance supports parents in making healthy informed choices. Packed lunches are provided for school trips as part of our Free School Meal provision to comply with National Food Standards. If parents of key stage 2 children wish to purchase a packed lunch from the school kitchen for a school trip, they are able to do so. Any meals taken as part of on or off school site residential will provide a balanced and healthy approach to meals and where possible we will look to use off site providers that comply with the National Food Standards.


Guidance on preparing a healthy, balanced lunchbox:

Try to include

- starchy foods these include bread, rice, potatoes, pasta
- protein foods including meat, fish, eggs, beans
- a dairy item this could be cheese or a yoghurt
- vegetables or salad and a portion of fruit
- a healthy drink such as water, milk or 100% fruit juice

Healthy Eating Ambassadors

Mablins Healthy Eating Ambassadors have come up with some great ideas for a healthy lunchbox. Have a read and see if you can get any new ideas for your lunchbox.



Healthy break time snacks in school:

All children in KS1 and Reception receive a free piece of fruit or vegetable everyday as part of the Governments School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme. If children wish to have a break time snack from home then this should be a healthy snack. No chocolate, crisps, sweets or fizzy drinks should be sent to school for snack time.

Special Diets / Allergies

The school recognises that some pupils may have verified medical conditions requiring special diets, which may impact on diet. In this case, parents/carers are urged to contact the school SENCo to discuss dietary requirements.

For these reasons pupils are:

- not permitted to swap food items
- not permitted to bring nuts and nut products in packed lunchboxes or for snacks - we are a NUT FREE school

HEALTHY SCHOOL REMINDERS

- No chocolate, crisps, sweets or fizzy drinks for snack time
- Do not share food with your friends
- We are a nut free school
