



School Meal Price Increase

Our School meals service is provided by Cheshire East Catering and their charges have remained unchanged for a number of years.

We have received formal notification from Cheshire East Catering that they will be increasing their prices with effect from 1st January 2024.

They have attributed the price increase to the following factors:

- 1. Substantial increases in food and labour costs over the last 12 months with further increases expected.
- 2. Reduced subsidies available to them due to local government budgetary pressures.

As a result of the above, Cheshire East Catering have no option other than to pass on some of the increased costs to us - their customer. In turn, we have no option but to pass on the price increase.

Therefore, with effect from 1st January 2024, the price of a school meal will rise to £2.75 per meal.

Payment for Trips & Dinners

Please can we remind parents that trips and dinners must be paid for in advance using the <u>Cheshire East School Shop epayment system</u>. If you are having difficulty with making a payment, check out the <u>parent guide</u>. The school office staff are happy to give advice or process the payment through the school office account.

Cheshire School Admissions 2024!

Applications are now open for children starting primary school in September 2024. Parents are strongly advised to apply for three preferences.

Applications must be submitted to the child's home local authority by:

 15 January 2024 for pupils starting primary in September 2024

Parents still need to apply even if the child has a brother or sister already at the school or the child is attending a nursery/preschool attached to the school.

Parents should consider how their child will travel to school when making preferences. Parents can find out about school transport at Free and subsidised school transport (cheshireeast.gov.uk)

Walking to School Safety Information

Green Cross Code

To be safe on the road you need to use the Green Cross Code.

- 1. Think
- 2. Stop
- 3. Look and listen
- 4. Wait
- 5. Look and listen again
- 6. Arrive alive

View Green Cross Code videos

1. Think

Find a safe place to cross the road. Where possible cross at a:















NEVER cross:







If you can't see a crossing, remember to cross where you can see in all directions and where drivers will see you.

2. Stop

- Just before you get to the kerb, stop.
- Stand on the pavement near the kerb and make sure that you can see the traffic. DO NOT step on to the road.

3. Look

 Look all around you for traffic. Make sure that you listen carefully for traffic that you can't see.

- Check to your right hand side first, then check to your left and then to your right again before you cross.
- Beware that some roads, called one way streets, have all of the traffic moving in the same direction.
- Watch out for bicycles or people on rollerblades. You often don't hear them but they travel very fast.

4. Wait

- If traffic is coming, let it pass.
- If you are waiting at a crossing then wait until the cars have stopped or, at pelican, toucan, puffin or pegasus crossings, the green man shows, before you cross.
- If you are not at a crossing wait until it is safe to cross
- Once the traffic has passed look around again and listen.

5. Look and listen again

When it is safe and there is no traffic, walk straight across the road.



Keep looking and listening while you cross the road. Watch out for cyclists, motorcyclists and horse riders. Always walk straight across the road, DO NOT walk diagonally.

NEVER run across the road because you might fall over and you might not get up in time.

6. Arrive alive

Look and keep looking while you cross the road.
